Who to speak to?

If you have concerns about your child's progress you should initially speak to your child's class teacher.

Eszter Solyom is the Special Educational Needs Coordinator, you can call the school office to make an appointment with her, or you can email her on esolyom@abacus-cfbt.org

What can parents expect?

Always come and make an appointment if you have any concerns about your child. If your child is on the SEN Register you will be invited to 3 meetings a year to discuss your child's progress. In addition, you are also welcome to book a double slot during parents meeting and request to meet with the SENCo as well as the class teacher.

The Team

All class teachers and teaching assistants support children in their class and across the school.

In addition, we have two highly skilled Higher Level Teaching Assistants, Nazira Begum and Jackie Bright, who provide additional support to children. The support will be supervised by the teacher and the SENCo to ensure the best possible outcomes.

Sometimes, children with additional needs can be referred to specialists we work with regularly, such as Speech and Language Therapists, Educational Psychologist, Play/Art Therapist, Occupational Therapist and a Dyslexia Specialist teacher. After parental consent has been gained, the specialists observe and/or assess children and provide the school with a specialist support programme. Occasionally, they work directly with students for a set period of time. Parents are involved in all decisions and communications with the specialists.
