In order to support school, any changes to buses, including pick-up changes need to come to the office before 1pm. This allows us time to update notes and make sure staff are informed.




We are also very happy to announce that we finally have **a PTA calendar** with our main events, please have a look from time to time as we might add or move some dates.



# Reception

We have had a wonderful week in reception. All our children are now with us and have all settled into the classroom wonderfully. They have loved exploring the different areas such as the construction area, art area and water area. Over the week, everyone has become a lot more confident with both their friends and the adults in the room as well as around school. It has been lovely watching friends reunite and new friendships form.

We have begun our phonics carpet sessions and focus groups this week. It has been fantastic to see so many children working hard to write the sounds we have learnt as well as label their work with their names. We will continue to practise our pencil grips and letter formation in the coming weeks.

Our topic this half term is dinosaurs. This week, we opened our 'Dinosaur Dig' role play area to the children, where they become fossil hunters, using brushes and shovels to dig for fossils. The children can often be found in their pretending to find all manner of dinosaur fossils particularly those of the T-Rex. Next week we will be learning more about dinosaurs such as when they lived and the names of some of different types of dinosaurs!

### Year 1



What another busy week in year 1. We are continuing to explore animals and animal classification. We learnt what fins and fur and feathers are for in science, and have been matching vocabulary. Three of our girls even put on a show about a cat, a dog, and a tiger. They wrote their own lines and used their own props. I wonder if we will have some performers again next week!?

The children have also all shown me what wonderful writers and readers they are as we have been practicing using handwriting lines and writing sentences about a story we are reading. We have started reading a chapter book together – A Faraway Tree Adventure!!

Maths has been all about sorting and counting – we made some interesting creations with blocks, we sorted buttons and bears, and even built animal homes with construction bricks outside.

#### Happy Friday!

We've had a great week in Year 2! Everyone has been doing such a great job with their learning and deserve a huge pat on the back.

In English we've been reading Jim and the Beanstalk. The children put their prediction skills to use, imagined what the giant might've been thinking in different parts of the story and even created a story map to retell the story.

Place value is this half term's focus in Maths. After a review on what place value is, we learned how to use our counting in 10s to help with counting objects up to 100 (10, 20, 30 ... 35 rather than 1, 2 ... 35). We also practiced representing numbers using dienes, making sure not to confuse our 10s for our 1s.

In art the children discovered how artists get inspiration from everything around them before sketching objects that inspire them.

Our topic focus is Life in the City. We compared human and physical features in England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland before focusing on Camden as a borough.

Science is all about animals and humans - this week we looked at the life cycle of humans. Everybody sorted different stages of the human life cycle in order and labelled them. The children decided that playing on a phone would be a good action to remember the term 'adolescent'. ©

## Year 3

I'd like to say a big, "Well done!" to the whole of Year 3 for an excellent first full week back at school. We managed to hit the ground running and I'm really excited about all our amazing learning in the year ahead.

In Guided Reading this week, we've been off to the mystical land of Nanvi Dar, high in the Himalayas, getting to know Lady Agatha and all the friendly yetis in The Abominables. The children have been really engaged, so why not ask your child to tell you all about it?

In English, we've been studying The Heart and the Bottle, a beautiful book by Oliver Jeffers. The children arrived on Monday to find an old, worn leather chair in the classroom and they were very curious, just like the little girl in the story. They enjoyed reading and responding to the text before creating a graph to show the little girl's feelings through the story, as she faced some real-life challenges.

In Maths, we've been getting into the swing of things learning place value – with lots of fun challenges.

While in Art, we were looking at Edger Degas and how he used charcoal and chalk to create dynamic pictures and we had a go ourselves. I think They really captured something of his magic!

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### Year 4

This week Year 4 have had an amazing start to their learning and they should be so proud of their behaviour and focus! They have definitely shown us they're ready for Year 4 learning!!!

In English we started our new text, Varmints! We explored what the word Varmint mean before we listened to the soundtrack for the trailer. We described what we could hear and used this to make predictions about what the book is about. We also explored 2 different settings, using noun phrases to describe and compare them.

In maths we started our Place Value work, looking at how the place of digits affects their value and how we can partition numbers. We also had a go at identifying numbers on a number line and smashed it!!!

In Science we started learning about our new Topic, Animals including Humans. We explored the digestive system and identified the different organs and their functions. We can't wait for our experiment where we investigate what actually happens to food inside us!!!

In Guided reading we have started our ne story, Boy At The Back Of The Class. We explored reasons why people may move away from their homes and then analysed our story. So far, we have met Ahmet, a young boy who has started in a new class who our main character would like to be friends with. We can't wait to find out more about him.

In Mandarin we have started learning all about how to say the different animals we might keep as pets. Ask us to show you our actions!

We also had a very special visitor I today who taught us all about Rosh Hashanah! We learnt about why Jewish people celebrate Rosh Hashanah and different things they do to celebrate. We also had some honey and apples and Challah bread together! Thank you so much Jennie, we had a great time!


